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Memory Verse

“Noah was a just man and perfect in his generations, and Noah walked with God.”

Genesis 6:9 (KJV)

The Story

When men multiplied on the earth, God saw that the wickedness of man was great and that every imagination of the thoughts of his heart was only evil continually. It repented the LORD that he had made man, and it grieved him at his heart, so he purposed to bring judgment. Yet in the middle of a corrupt and violent world, one man stood out: Noah found grace in the eyes of the LORD.

Genesis 6:5-8

Noah was a just man, perfect in his generations, who walked with God, and he had three sons, Shem, Ham, and Japheth. God told Noah that the end of all flesh had come and that he would establish his covenant with him. Noah was to build an ark of gopher wood, three hundred cubits by fifty by thirty, pitched within and without, with a window, a door in the side, and three stories.

Genesis 6:9-16

God commanded Noah to bring two of every living thing into the ark, male and female, and of clean beasts and fowls by sevens, to keep them alive. Noah did all that God commanded him. Then the LORD said to enter, and in the selfsame day Noah, his wife, his three sons, and their wives went in, eight souls in all, and the LORD shut him in (Genesis 7:16). Genesis 6:19-7:13

In the six hundredth year of Noah's life the fountains of the great deep broke up and the windows of heaven were opened, and the rain fell forty days and forty nights. The waters prevailed and bore up the ark above the earth for a hundred and fifty days, and Noah only remained alive, and they that were with him (Genesis 7:23). Then God remembered Noah, sent a wind, and the waters began to go down until the ark rested on the mountains of Ararat. Genesis 7:11-8:4

Noah sent out a raven, then a dove three times; the second time the dove returned with an olive leaf, and the third time she did not return, so Noah knew the earth was dry. When they went forth, Noah built an altar and offered burnt offerings, and the LORD smelled a sweet savour. God blessed Noah, promised never again to destroy all living things by a flood, and set his bow in the cloud as the token of that everlasting covenant. Genesis 8:7-9:15
