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Memory Verse

“So God created man in his own image, in the image of God created he him; male and female created he them.”

Genesis 1:27 (KJV)

The Story

Genesis 1 begins without argument or defence: In the beginning God created the heaven and the earth. There is no account of where God came from, because the chapter is not making a case for him, it is reporting what he did. The earth was without form, and void; and darkness was upon the face of the deep. Into that emptiness the Spirit of God moved upon the face of the waters, and God spoke. Let there be light, and there was light. The pattern for the whole chapter is set in that sentence: God speaks, and what he says exists. [Genesis 1:1-3](#)

The first three days form the world; the second three fill it. Day one divides light from darkness. Day two makes the firmament dividing the waters, called Heaven. Day three gathers the waters into Seas so the dry land, called Earth, can appear, and the land brings forth grass, herbs, and fruit trees, each yielding seed after his kind. That phrase, after his kind, repeats through the chapter: what God made was made to continue, carrying its own future inside it. [Genesis 1:4-13](#)

Day four fills the sky God had made: two great lights, the greater to rule the day, the lesser to rule the night, and the stars also, set for signs, and for seasons, and for days, and years. Day five fills the sea and air with great whales and every winged fowl, and God blesses them to be fruitful and multiply. Day six fills the land with cattle, creeping things, and beasts of the earth, each after his kind. Every stage ends the same way, with God seeing that it was good. [Genesis 1:14-25](#)

Then the language changes. God does not say Let the earth bring forth, but Let us make man in our image, after our likeness. So God created man in his own image, in the image of God created he him; male and female created he them. Man is not made as a better animal but as an image, and is given dominion over the fish of the sea, the fowl of the air, the cattle, and every creeping thing. Dominion here is stewardship inside a world that already belongs to God, not ownership of it.

[Genesis 1:26-28](#)

God provides food for man and beast alike from the seed-bearing plants and fruit trees. Then comes the verdict on the whole: And God saw every thing that he had made, and, behold, it was very good. Through the chapter individual works were good; only the finished whole is very good. On the seventh day God ended his work and rested, and he blessed the seventh day and sanctified it, because in it he had rested from all his work. Rest is not exhaustion here but completion, built into the world from the start. [Genesis 1:29-2:3](#)
